Age appropriate water slides, water tables and water toys will be available for your child to enjoy. Also, on Wednesdays, campers will enjoy a rotation through the STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) room. Campers will also be able to play on the playgrounds, in the gym, and enjoy down-time in the classrooms. June 17-21—OCEANOGRAPHERS

Let's discover our coast and all its treasures. We will dance and sing to beach songs, measure how long a whale is, and play with parachutes and beach balls. In art we will make a treasure chest craft and make an octopus. In story time, we will listen to stories about the Wright Brothers' first flight and hear the story [How to be a Pirate](#). In the movement/activity room, we will play "Fish in the Ocean" and play "Musical Beach Towels!" For snack this week, we will have Pirate Booty and watermelon.

June 24-28—Professional Athletes

In our city we are so lucky to have so many professional teams to support. As we do the wave, run the bases, and shoot some hoops, we will listen to fun sport themed songs! In story time, we will listen to [Salt in His Shoes](#) and [Curious George at the Baseball Game](#). In the movement/activity room, we will have team chants and sing "Take Me Out to the Ballgame." Our art projects will include making a sports pennant and team jersey. Snacks will include orange slices for recovery and super bowl snack mix.

July 1-5 (CLOSED JULY 4th) — PIONEERS

We will go back in time this week singing and dancing to old favorites like "Ring Around the Rosey" and "Here We Go Around the Mulberry Bush." In story time, we will hear about how children had chores and hear about the Biltmore House in Asheville, NC. In the movement/activity room, we will play tug of war and play London Bridge. For art we will make a wig out of cotton balls. Our special snack this week will be tea cookies.

July 8-12 — Mountaineers

It's so hot outside this time of the year— so let's run for the hills! The opening will include campers gathering around camp fires and singing to camp songs like "Go Tell It On the Mountain". For story time, we will listen to [Amelia Bedelia Goes Camping](#) and [Goldilocks](#). For our art projects, we will make binoculars and fishing rods. Our snacks will include teddy grahams and rainbow trout! (rainbow goldfish).

July 15-19—Thrill Seekers

We will learn about the White Water Center, Carowinds, Tweestie and the Land of Oz. Each day will be an adventure as we get our train passes stamped. We will follow the yellow brick road and try a ropes course. In story time, we learn and listen to stories about our states themed parks. For our special art projects, we will make a RR crossing sign. In the movement/activity room, we will pretend to be on a raft and get sprayed with water bottles! Special snacks this week include making train tracks out of pretzel sticks and bugles.

July 22-26 — Fact Seekers

This week we will learn about some of our areas most popular museums: Discovery Place, NASCAR, Nature Museum and ImaginOn. We will enjoy activities such as, puppet shows, pretending to race cars, and seeing how fast a watermelon will burst! Songs will include the theme song from Cars and "Molecule Freeze!" In art we will be making our own slime and painting race cars. In the movement/activity room, we will play protons, neutrons and electrons; children will enjoy a tire obstacle. In story time, we will listen to [Scientist Scientist, What Do You See?](#) For snack this week, we will have rice crispy treats and edible slime (Jell-O).

July 26-Aug 2 —Zoologist

This week we will explore our NC zoos. We will go on a lion hunt and listen to songs like "The Lion Sleeps Tonight." Story time will include books like [Giraffes Can't Dance](#) and [Let's Go to the Zoo](#). In the movement /activity room, we will play pass the banana and animal movement games. Art will include projects like animal masks and a craft stick crocodile. Snack time will include oranges and animal crackers.

Aug 5-9 —Carolínians

For our last week of summer camp, we will see what is like to live in North Carolina— from going to the State Fair, to the beaches, to the mountains, to a professional sports game. We will enjoy a variety of fair games, campfire songs, animal games, and beach fun. In story time, we will hear stories about our state fair and fun facts about North Carolina. In the movement/activity room, we will pin the tire on the tractor and pretend to walk the plank. Our art projects will include making a state flag. Our snacks will be apples with caramel and soft pretzels.
